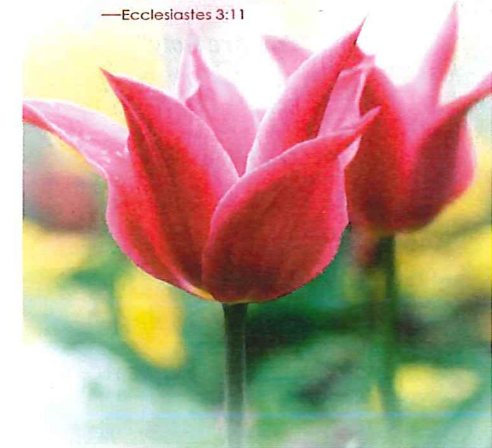

CHURCH LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

The Landscape Committee has been at work planning the landscaping of the grounds at the new Church property. There are no budgeted funds set aside for the landscaping, so some members have made initial donations to pay for the supplies for a drip irrigation system. In order to save costs at a later date, other church members have volunteered to soon install the piping needed prior to the parking lot being paved. Many ideas for future development of the entire property have been discussed, however; that will need to be done in stages and planned for future development as funds become available. Initially, a low maintenance design plan for specific shrubbery and trees for around the building and for the islands will be submitted to the Building Committee for approval so that there will be a cohesive design. Before anything further can be done, we need to enlist your help to cover the initial costs of landscaping.

If you would like to contribute specifically toward the landscaping of the church property, or in memory or honor of someone, checks for monetary landscaping donations may be made payable to **BRUMC** and **marked for "landscaping"**. Memorial funds will be recorded and recognized, and funds will be used to purchase shrubbery or trees from a wholesale nursery.

NORTH GEORGIA DELEGATION

General Conference Day By Day

Day 1 - Sunday, Feb 24th

The first official day of the session will be Sunday, Feb 24th. The session will begin with worship. Delegates will hear a presentation from the Commission on Way Forward - whose formation General Conference authorized in 2016 to help find ways to keep the church together.

They will then spend the day in plenary discussion seeking to discern which of the multiple plans the majority of delegates want to refine.

This is not a day for amending legislation but instead determining what general direction the delegates want to go in. Bishops, who have no vote at General Conference, will preside over the day's discussions.

Day 2 - Monday, Feb 25th

On Monday, Feb 25th, the delegates will meet in a legislative committee of the whole to amend and vote on petitions. Delegates will elect the chair of the committee from a pool of delegates who have been trained and served as committee chairs in 2016.

Day 3 - Feb 26th

The delegates will return to plenary on Tuesday, Feb 26th, for final voting and to consider what their actions mean for the future, including the next regularly scheduled General Conference in 2020. Again, bishops will preside. The session will adjourn on Tuesday.
